**1. The little ones!** We wouldn't exist if it weren't for the children. Experiencing transformation in children like Chyla



reminds us that God has incredible plans for each one of these kids! Chyla was struggling in all her classes and has repeated grades in the past. Her mom works 12 hour days and her father isn't around. This year, after she started doing daily one-on-one tutoring she began to hand in her homework on time, show interest in her classes, and even have confidence in herself and God for the first time since she started school! Real life transformation is possible and children

Construction has also meant being able to employ over 30 workers who are dads, uncles, and grandpas of our students. Many of them shared this was the first time in months or even years to find a regular job. One of the workers exclaimed, *"This is the first Christmas since I can remember that I will have money to buy food and some small gifts for my family!"*

## WORSHIP VALUES

What do you love about worship at Grace? Is it the same thing that the folks who sit behind you on Sundays love? Is it something we've done for a long time, or something new we've just started?

What do you wish was different? Could the thing you would change be something someone else loves deeply?

I came to Grace because I wanted a church that felt authentic, diverse, and welcoming. I wanted a place where my kids could learn about God and about other people -- lots of kinds of people. When we visited Grace, we knew it was the right place for us. But one of the hard parts about being a church with lots of different kinds of people is that we all think differently, have different preferences, have different histories. And this shows up on Sunday mornings.

The worship committee read a book called <u>Diverse</u> <u>Worship</u> last year. We began to wonder about the assumptions that we all make about worship at Grace -- why we do things the way we do -- and whether those assumptions are shared. We would probably all say we are committed to diversity -- but what that means for song selection, faces in the front of the service, organs and dancing and the way we pray.... It seems we all have different ideas about those topics. While we have all likely chosen Grace in part because of its diversity, we haven't had a way to articulate what Grace Church does in worship, and how it's different than another church.

So last January we called together a big group of members of Grace who participated in worship in some way -- planning, playing instruments, dancing, leading kids,



running sound, etc. We asked two questions: What do you love about worship at Grace? What do you wish was different? We learned a lot, laughed a lot, and got a lot of ideas about why each of us is drawn to this congregation.

The worship committee took a year to craft a statement that would help articulate how we worship at Grace, and why we do it that way. We're calling it our <u>Worship Values</u>. There are seven sections, and during the season of Lent, Pastor Jack will preach through those values one-by-one. We hope it will lead us to a shared sense of how God has uniquely called us to worship at this church.

We would also like to use these values as a way to learn more about one other. So we're asking you to tell us what you think! Each week, on Grace Church's facebook page (www.



facebook.com/ GraceChurchGR) we'll post a question based on the sermon / value for that Sunday, and we hope you'll participate in the discussion.

Our hope is that this series of values will help us grow to speak with one voice about who God is calling us to be as the worshiping community of Grace Church.
