Andrew Cross 1910-2015


Andrew Cross was 40 years old when he became a member of Buckley Chapel which became Grace Church 12 years later in 1962. He and his wife, Viola, set records of faithfulness which are not likely to ever be broken. Viola was a member of the Priscilla Circle for study, fellowship and service for 45 years. Andrew served as a founding deacon and for uncounted terms as deacon and elder for 45 years until his health failed.

Andrew and Viola (Collins) were baptized as followers of Jesus Christ at young ages in Arkansas where they were married on January 17, 1932. They moved to Grand Rapids in 1943 with their first five children, Andrew Jr., Annette,

Irma Jean, Milton and Bernice. The other five children were born when they lived within four blocks of Grace Church: Velma, Carolyn, Florence, Joyce and Francine. Their family was precious to them and their values were rooted in Christ. Weekly worship and daily prayer sustained their faith, hope and love.



Andrew was known as a worker. Beginning at age 9 he remembered learning how to pick cotton on the farm. He worked as a laborer at the C&O Railroad vard in Grand Rapids. When he "retired" from that iob in 1975 he continued to work at many other jobs and was honored with a visit to



the White House for his model employment in 1996.

Those who knew Andrew even casually knew him for his praising the Lord no matter what the circumstances of his life. Those who knew him better as a brother in Christ could learn that his favorite hymn was: "Just as I am, without one plea, but that thy blood was shed for me, and that thou bid'st me come to thee, O Lamb of God, I come, I come."

The best picture of Andrew's faith and life was seen at Grace Church on Sunday morning, January 31, 1994. Andrew and Viola were filled with gratitude and praise. Four generations of their family were there. Drew Weatherall, their great-grandson, was baptized. Drew's parents, Murry Jr. and Marcene professed

their faith in Christ and became Grace Church members. His parents Murry Sr. (Peter) and Joyce (Cross) were there

for Murry Sr. and Drew's baptisms. Two baptisms, two professions of faith, and four generations celebrated God's covenantal grace.

For Andrew, that day called for loudest praise. Until today.
